Calendar - The 2019-2020 school calendar is posted on our website. Please look at it closely and note the changes.

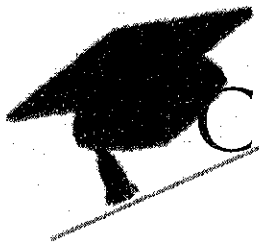



unfortunately, we did not have our annual drive-your-tractor-to-school day! We plan to do so during National Ag Week, which is March 10th-14th.

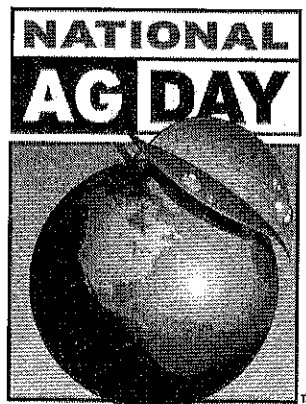
