Parents and Students,

Here is our current plan to provide food service for our students of Crofton Community Schools and St. Rose of Lima School at NO COST. Beginning Monday, March 23rd, we will provide breakfast and lunch using a grab and go method. This service can only be provided for current students at this time. We plan to make this available on Mondays and Thursdays. Mondays will include meals for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. Thursdays will include meals for Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday (we are still waiting to hear if we can provide weekend meals). We will be providing these in several locations for both town and rural students. As we go through the process these sites may change based on guidelines we need to follow along with the number of students participating in the program.

### Lunch Count

In order to get as accurate a count as we can for each day we need anyone requesting meals for Mondays to contact the high school office at 402-388-2440 or by email to [rwilken@croftonwarriors.org](mailto:rwilken@croftonwarriors.org) by **noon on the Friday** before Monday pick up and by **noon on the Wednesday** before Thursday pick up. **Please let us know which location you plan to use.**

Any student who would like meals will be required to be there in person, as this is a rule set by the state program. We know there could be adjustments made to all of this including drop off sites, days and times as we determine participation levels. We will do our best to make sure everyone has an opportunity to benefit from the program.

We encourage all students to participate in this program. Lunch meals will include a cold cut and cheese sandwich, fresh fruit, fresh veggies, and milk. Breakfast meals will include cereal, graham crackers, fresh fruit, and milk. Feel free to contact the high school office with any questions.
